#### and Challenging Ourselves with New Initiatives

Dear Friends of Communities In Schools,

This past school year was a blend of familiar experiences and new endeavors. The familiar allowed us to build upon a solid foundation of previous successes and to continuously improve our approach and practices. The new endeavors, which we will touch on below, stimulated us through a mix of nervous anticipation of the unknown and excitement about new possibilities — both vital to the work we do to support kids and families.

The familiar included: generous donors supporting CIS; volunteers committing their time, energy and talent to support students one-on-one; partners engaging with CIS to maximize efficiency and breadth of access; dedicated site coordinators servings as a caring adult and connecting students to much needed services; central office staff gathering resources to equip our site coordinators with the tools they need to support kids; CIS ambassadors spreading the good news about great work that we do; and investing in our team to make CIS great place to work.

We were also challenged and excited about new initiatives that we added this year. We launched a push-in tutoring program in the high schools' Algebra I classes, which is an essential course for prospective high school graduates and college-bound students. We provided individualized academic coaching for on-track, low-income students to accelerate their academic achievement. We sponsored a group of students to attend an HBCU (historically black college and university) tour, resulting in several of them enrolling to attend in Fall 2023. In the spring, we piloted a mentoring and life-skills club that is designed to increase adult male engagement with boys of color.

Blending the familiar with the new is what keeps CIS progressing to better support students. To our long-time donors, partners, and volunteers, thank you for being a reliable source of support over the years and for your willingness to increase your support over time. To those that are newer to our community of support, thank you for helping CIS to broaden and deepen our impact for kids.

# Your support at work in schools.

CIS of Kalamazoo provides targeted and sustained support to students where they are—in the school. Through school-wide services, more than 11,500 students in 22 schools benefit from CIS in their building. Targeted supports include individual and small group tutoring, mentoring, mental and physical health, after school enrichment and summer supports. Each of these supports adds an empowering element to students' makeup and increases their capacity to achieve in school and in life.

**Removing barriers and keeping kids in school.** By teaming up with over 45 community partners, CIS of Kalamazoo connects students to the right resources at the right time.

**400** individuals shared their time and talent with students through CIS. Of those volunteers, 191 were college volunteers and 209 were community volunteers providing over 11,000 combined hours of support.

356 students visited the CIS supported FHC Mobile Dental Clinic for cleanings and sealants.\* 149 students visited the Family Health Center Mobile Health Clinic supported by CIS for well child exams and/or immunizations.

~\$63,000 was funded to support students with no or inadequate insurance to cover mental health services. Approximately 200 students received 2,484 hours of professional mental health services, including individual counseling and/or small

group services.

**11,662** food packs were distributed to elementary students. Food pantries supported secondary students and families by filling 13,813 food orders.

**13,550** items of clothing, personal hygiene products, and school supplies were distributed to students.
